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Zum Inhalt:

Die Europäische Beratende Kommission stellte zwischen Dezember 1943 und August 1945 entscheidende Weichen für die Nachkriegspolitik. Dieser Band, der die I. Reihe der Edition abschließt, dokumentiert erstmals umfassend die Verhandlungen der Regierungsvertreter Großbritanniens, der USA, der Sowjetunion und später auch Frankreichs über die Behandlung Deutschlands bei Beendigung des Zweiten Weltkriegs. Trotz heftiger Auseinandersetzungen kam eine Reihe zentraler Dokumente alliierter Deutschlandpolitik zustande: z. B. der Entwurf einer Kapitulationserklärung und das Abkommen über die Verwaltung Groß-Berlins. Die Europäische Beratende Kommission schuf die Geschäftsgrundlage des Viermächte-Status, der endgültig erst mit der Wiedervereinigung Deutschlands 1990 beseitigt wurde.

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
